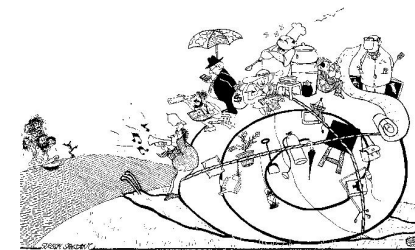

Introduction to development politics

The media and the public mainly consider development politics to be merely developmental aid or international developmental cooperation. Even though these areas do define the image in the public space, the contribution of this aid to the real development in the southern countries is often being called into question.

As we see on the example of the global economic crisis the financial, economic and trade policies of the northern countries have a major influence on the development of the economies in transition and developing countries in a whole.

The impact of the crisis is immense: decline in the world trade and investments, decreasing exports due to the falling demand, drop in the remittances from migrant labourers (with the worldwide amount of 282 billion USD it is almost triple of the entire developmental aid).

As a result of the crisis the fiscal deficit of many of the developing countries has increased, in the mid-term they would be forced to take up further borrowings. They would become even more dependant on the World Bank and the IMF. Unemployment, poverty and even more hunger would be the consequences.

What is more the crisis lead to the change in the structures and institutions which triggered it. The regulation of the financial markets, a reform of the international financial institutions (World Bank, WTO and IMF) as well as of WTO-trade regulations are important prerequisites for the developing countries to get an opportunity to press ahead their internal development.

Apart from external factors, internal conditions such as good governance, fight against corruption and structural reforms are very import factors for the development of these countries. The same is true for the countries of the North which should optimize their consumption of energy and other resources to give southern countries a chance for development.

This seminar should provide an overview about the structures and actors of the international developmental cooperation and an insight into the theoretical approach of development. We would also look into the work of international financial institutions and discuss tangible solutions.
